GPS-God's Plan for Sharing GPS Results

The following statistics have been received from the churches that conducted the GPS prayer walking and gospel presentations. Some others may have participated but I do not have the numbers at this time.

From the information I received, approximately 3400 homes were prayer walked and a gospel message was shared with the same number of homes. According to the mapping center at NAMB, there are 13,929 homes in Carroll and Benton Counties. Much work is still to be done. It is not too late to modify the GPS program to fit your church setting and make contact with some of the homes in the counties.
